While we experienced a staff transition partway through the year, we are so pleased with the impact of our programming at Columbia Borough Middle School Taylor Campus, which is demonstrated through our impressive outcomes. Our site coordinators have done an amazing job establishing CISPA programming at Columbia Borough Middle School Taylor campus and in the community.

A new CISPA site coordinator, Kim Robinson-Hodges, joined the team at Columbia Taylor Middle School Taylor Campus in the spring. Since then, Kim has become an important member of the school community. She set her sights on assisting students, engaging with families, and fostering positive relationships with school staff. Kim kept parents informed through various means, including flyers, phone calls, and home visits. Her efforts resulted in engagement with 90 parents, which was a 2% increase in parent engagement from the 2021-2022 school year.

Her efforts also led to a partnership with Majik Rent-A-Center, which donated a washer and dryer to the school's life skills classroom. This important asset helps students develop essential tools for success in the emotional, social, and intellectual aspects of life.

During the 2022-2023 school year, Kim prioritized creating a safe and supportive environment to enhance the school experience for all students. She was part of the Positive Behavior Intervention System Committee established at Columbia Middle School - Taylor Campus, and Tier I PBIS was implemented. Throughout the year, several events were organized to engage students, faculty, and families, including field day, end-of-year celebrations, field trips, and teacher appreciation events.

As we kick off the 2023-2024 school year, Kim is eager to build upon these connections she has worked hard to create, and we can't wait to see the creativity, inspiration, and success her efforts will foster.
